**Speak out to end the genocide in Darfur,
to prevent another genocide in South Sudan
and to support peace and justice in all of Sudan**

Over 3 million people from Darfur live in desperate situations in Internally Displaced Persons camps in Darfur and refugee camps in Chad. The Comprehensive Peace Agreement which ended the North/South Civil War in Sudan in 2005 is in danger of collapsing. In the past, the government in Khartoum has engaged in mass killings of civilians in both Darfur and South Sudan. If the Comprehensive Peace Agreement falls apart, war will return to South Sudan, and the millions of displaced people in Darfur will be cut off from humanitarian aid. *Millions of lives are at risk.* Our voices, encouraging President Obama and other world leaders to work to bring a lasting peace to Sudan, can help prevent the next genocide of the 21st century.

We will gather at Emanuel Lutheran Church before sunrise (sunrise is at 7:22 AM on Dec. 21) and hear some inspiring speakers about what is happening in Sudan and how we can help. We'll then take our signs and posters out to the busy intersections so that the thousands of people on their way to work will know that genocide threatens Sudan – and we can do something to prevent it.
