**I Am Not Your Mother But I Play Her In Real Life:
 A look at our responsibility for children who are not our own.**

Kamora Le'Ella Herrington is the Director of Youth Programming at True Colors, Inc., a support and advocacy organization for sexual minority youth based in Hartford, Connecticut as well as an instructor in the City of Hartford's YDPA and MMI Institutes. Herrington has over 20 years of experience in the human services field and has become a vocal advocate for LGBT youth. She attended Springfield College and discovered during her semester of student teaching that she wasn't cut out to be an elementary school teacher.

In 2009, Herrington appeared on the Tyra Show titled "Hell to Pay: Gay Teen Exorcism" and was featured on the CNN special report titled "Gay Teens Talk Their Truth." She is a 2010 Faith Works Fellow with the Conference of Churches based in Hartford and is committed to bringing understanding to the intersectionalities of identity. Over the last year she has begun working with other Hartford area leaders to address the myriad of ways that trauma affects residents as well as the Hartford Police Department on new ways of looking at community policing.

Herrington, a member of the National Black Justice Coalition's (NBJC) Leadership Advisory Council, is an activist leader at the "OUT on the Hill Black LGBT Leadership Summit" in Washington, D.C. where she collaborates with other thought leaders, faith leaders, philanthropists and activists who are organizing to empower their communities while educating Congressional leaders, the Obama Administration and federal agencies about Black LGBT public policy concerns.

Her proudest accomplishment has been raising her two sons.



"On the Journey"**



"Let this work--our commitment to combat white supremacy culture 'out there' and 'in here' be and keep becoming a deeper and ever-more-constant aspect of our spiritual practice as Unitarian Universalists. Let us not stop when we get annoyed by someone else's reaction, when we feel we've done enough, when we've taken an action and feel self-satisfied. Let us not stop there."--RevHeather, "On the Journey" at the Unitarian Society of Hartford, May 7, 2017.

This past Sunday's #WhiteSupremacyTeachIn service truly felt to me like an important congregational wrestling, and I so appreciate every single one of you who was here and who stayed until the very end of the unusually-long, unusually-important service. Hearing from USH members Gloria Francesca Mengual, Margalie Belizaire, and Lindsey Jones was moving and profound--huge thanks go out to each of them and to all those of you who shared from your hearts for this service--Flo Grieb, Laurie Kelliher, and Rayla Mattson in particular contributed your thoughts and great care to its preparation. I think one of the sensory experiences I'll hold close to my heart in the days, weeks, and months ahead is looking out and seeing all of you that morning singing "We Are Building Up a New World," words in English and in Spanish by Dr. Vincent Harding and Rev. Anne Dunlap. You rose to the challenge that it is for some to sing a new song and sang out those Spanish verses just as loudly as the rest. I felt your energy and your commitment in the room and I will not soon forget it. Let us keep on moving forward together.

An important piece that I did not delve into primarily for reasons of time is that of specific ways that White Supremacy Culture can show up in our communities. Perfectionism, a Sense of Urgency, Defensiveness, Quantity over Quality -- there are some great specific things to think about outlined here. Please take the time to read this article, and let's keep the conversation, reflection, and action going.

Are you ready to practice our Fifth Unitarian Universalist Principle, "...the use of the democratic process"? We have a Presidential Election coming up--for President of the Unitarian Universalist Association. This will be a historic election

no matter what--all three candidates are women, and we have not yet ever had a UUA President who is a woman. Based on our current membership number (206) the Unitarian Society of Hartford is granted five member delegates. Delegates do not have to travel to General Assembly (in New Orleans this June) or even register as off-site delegates (a small cost) in order to vote. Voting will start online on June 1. Would you consider being one of our five member delegates? We want to make sure to vote early and use all our votes!

Greater Hartford Cohousing

Community – Sustainability – Life Enhancement

We are a group of households planning to build an urban cohousing project in Greater Hartford. We intend to create a project that fosters community bonds and sustainable living through thoughtful design. Our vision is to create an adult-centered community in or near the city of Hartford so we can enjoy its diverse amenities and peoples, become part of the fabric of our neighborhood, and encourage aging in place.

We currently consist of three households that have met weekly for a year. During that time, we have created a legal entity, completed a feasibility study with a nonprofit development consultant, consulted with architects who specialize in

cohousing, and identified several properties that could work, while still on the look-out for other promising sites.

Our building plan will encourage sociability as well as providing ample opportunities for privacy. It will consist of 22 to 30 private living units with 1 to 3 bedrooms, clustered around a large outdoor courtyard that provides opportunities for socializing and gardening, as well as a large common house—the ‘heart’ of the project—which will feature a large dining area and kitchen for shared meals, and other amenities desired by the community.

Legally and financially our project will be structured as a condominium. Unlike a conventional condominium, however, we seek to build the community first and engage members in the project, both as early equity investors and as designers. These early joiners will become co-creators of their cohousing community. For further information on cohousing see www.cohousing.org

We welcome your interest in our pioneering venture. Our current aim is to reach a critical mass of members who will eventually commit to joining us. If you think cohousing might be a good fit for you, let's get together.
