denominational conference General Assembly (GA) 2018, actively commenting on and taking notes, and enjoying the ability to connect with and learn from colleagues while serving as off-site delegates. Join RevHeather on Thursday afternoon at the Meeting House if you'd like to watch some of the General Assembly workshops or business sessions, and enjoy the GA-centered service on Sunday morning. We

will be going to Oregon for our annual trip west to visit with RevHeather's family, June 30-July 12.

The small congregation that RevHeather was consulting for in Massachusetts decided not to renew her contract, but, happily, another opportunity arose in Danbury, Connecticut, to "fill-in" as their half-time Consulting Minister for the coming year (they had an unsuccessful two rounds of search for a settled minister). This is a positive convergence. Feel free to share your stories of Fairfield County or contacts you have in the Danbury-area with RevHeather.

Also, on Monday afternoon RevHeather was arrested while engaging in civil disobedience calling for a Moral Revival in our country, for our country to re-prioritize the lives of the poor, the working, the sick, and the immigrant. Here are more notes from that experience: "I was arrested for blocking the street, with 4 other people, next to Connecticut's State Capitol building. It was the same action that the CT Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival has done for at least 4 other Moral Mondays over the past 40 days of the Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival, so it was very smooth. We sat in the (sex/gender-segregated, and hot!) police wagon for a while, then in the jail cell for some hours, were processed ("booked"?), fingerprinted, fed some bologna sandwiches around dinnertime, allowed to talk and sing to our heart's content, and released around 9pm. There was a lovely crew awaiting our release and I was given a ride by the marvelous Rev. Erica Richmond back to my car. We have a court date at the end of the month and will probably get assigned 3 days of community service (litter pick-up and the like) around the city. I'd do it again in a heartbeat and only wish it had a whole lot more of an impact. I wish there were more things to DO! <u>#FamiliesBelongTogether</u> We need a #MoralRevival!" We are, thankfully, hearing from some colleagues around the country that local people and clergy engaging in civil disobedience can help elected officials feel they have the support and expectation to speak up and speak out in Congress. Oppose "DACA compromise" immigration bill by June 22.

Call: Your one House rep and two senators, especially Republicans (look up).

Script: Hi. I'm from [ZIP] calling to oppose the Goodlatte immigration bill. It <u>hurts farmworkers</u>, will <u>deport more Dreamers</u>, and keeps <u>children in detention longer</u>. Call: Your three Members of Congress, especially Republicans (<u>look</u> up).

Script: Hi. I'm from [ZIP]. I just learned about the so-called <u>tent city</u> <u>in Tornillo, Texas</u> built to house 450 immigrant children. I do not want my tax dollar paying for this. I want [name] to stop all further construction of <u>immigrant prison camps</u> by co-sponsoring the DONE Act (S. 2849/H.R. 5820). Can I count on this?




