Have you weighed in on the AIM survey yet? - So far, 24 people have responded to the AIM task force survey and we're very grateful to all of you for sharing your views and your own needs about how well we accommodate people with a disability in our church. But, if you haven't done it yet, what are you waiting for? Please, right now before you get busy or forget about it, go to <http://www.SurveyMonkey.com/r/Z99X2NN> and be sure your needs and opinions are reflected in the projects we do to make the Meeting House more accessible and the workshops we offer related to disabilities over the next several years. You can finish reading Enews later.

Based on early returns, we've learned some interesting and surprising things about our congregation, like:

1. More than half of the people sitting in the pews during a worship service sometimes have trouble hearing what's said or seeing what's going on.
2. There's strong support for the hearing loop we just installed and for improving the lighting but providing ASL interpretation in our services is giving better lighting a run for its money. What do you think?
3. There's an enthusiastic "write-in" campaign for an accessible playground. Would you support that?
4. With just a few exceptions, we all have somebody close to us with a mental illness.

Most of the people who submitted the survey chose to be anonymous but you can sign it if you want to. It took between 4 minutes (must have been a speed typist) and an hour and a half (must have taken a nap) to complete the survey.

So, if you have time, please let us know what you think. If you want to, you can just skip the questions you don't want to answer. And thank you!

Please join us at UConn School of Law on Monday, Oct. 10, 2016, to hear three professionals who have studied South Carolina's history of race relations share perspectives on their studies and personal experiences with that state's complex history.

The forum, History of Slavery and Race in South Carolina, is sponsored by the law school with the Connecticut Historical Society, the George W. Crawford Black Bar Association, the Harriet Beecher Stowe Center and the Black Law Students Association, the Asian Pacific American Law Students Association and the Diversity Committee at UConn School of Law.



James Bowers, Esq. was among the students who integrated the University of South Carolina in the 1960s. He attended Harvard Law School and then returned to be the first African-American professor of law at the University of South Carolina. After serving for a number of years as corporate counsel at Aetna, he is now senior counsel at Day Pitney.



Eric Foner is the DeWitt Clinton Professor of History at Columbia University. He is a widely recognized scholar and national authority on American political history, and has written extensively on the American South.



Manisha Sinha is the Draper Professor of Early American History at the University of Connecticut, and has published and spoken widely on the history of slavery, abolition movements and the Civil War, including a focus on South Carolina.

The discussion will begin at 5:30 p.m. in the Reading Room in William F. Starr Hall, 45 Elizabeth Street, on the law school campus in Hartford. Attorney Bowers and Professors Sinha and Foner will share perspectives based on their scholarship and personal experiences, and then invite questions from the audience. A reception will follow at 7 p.m.

WEST HARTFORD - The worldwide refugee crisis is without parallel in human history. Refugees, millions, mostly women and children, are in crisis! Not since the end of WW II have so many human beings been displaced from their homes and country. They had to leave, not by choice, everything they know and love: risking their lives, yearning for a safe space to live and work with human dignity. Therefore, our focus for UN Day 2016 will be Refugees. The meeting will be held on Sunday, Oct. 23, from 1 to 3 p.m. at the Universalist Church of West Hartford, 433 Fern St. It will be followed by a Neely Bruce concert at 3 pm, a singing of the "Bill of Rights"; a fundraiser for refugee resettlement.

The program will address the following topics: 1) Refugees: a worldwide reality; 2) An examination of elements contributing to the refugee crisis; 3) Refugee

resettlement and integration in Connecticut; 4) Local and statewide efforts and an action plan.

Professor Ilgu Ozler, Director of Global Engagement at SUNY, New Platz will offer an overview of the world refugee situation. Henry Lowendorf, New Haven Peace Council, will explore issues of racism and violence which displace millions of people, compelling them to relocate. Joyce Rawitscher, Israel/Palestine Peace Group of Northeastern Connecticut, will educate us on the Palestinian refugee crisis. Janet Bauer, Professor at Trinity College and member of the Commission of Refugees and Immigration Affairs will outline refugee resettlement in Connecticut with an eyewitness account describing recent refugees being resettled and integrated into Connecticut. The moderator will be Joseph Baxer, President of the United Nations Association of Connecticut.
