## Sunday Service Recap by Kayla Costenoble ~ Dec. 11, 2016

### “Disciplined Spirit”

There are 40 days from today (in case you weren't counting) until Donald Trump is inaugurated, Rev. Heather reminded us during today's service. Although "I wake up every morning feeling overwhelmed," we must use these days to keep strong, love more fiercely, build resistance in ourselves and in our community, AND defend and protect all the marginalized communities that are at greater risk now, she said.

"December is such a crucial time," Rev. Heather said. At this time last year, her sermon topic was "Just Get Me Through December." This year, she has a new countdown: "40 Days of Focus...and Beyond." She read a long list of names and events for whom 40 days was important—including Moses, Jesus, and Noah—and all endured testing, trials and tribulation.

We must be clear in choosing where our priorities are. It is important to pick issues we are especially concerned and passionate about, and get ourselves

organized to do more in an “urgent attempt to protect the vulnerables,” she said. To jump-start these 40 days, members were given two blank file cards and a pen. On each, we were asked to write what we are personally “doing/reading/thinking/planning on/committing to.” This will begin a church-wide effort to brainstorm, list, organize, fine-tune and flesh out ways to build resilience and focused action-taking in our local communities. One card we gave back to Rev. Heather; one we kept to remind ourselves what we had written.

As we have come to expect and look forward to, appropriate words from others enhanced the service. Poet Adrienne Rich, who died in 2012, explored issues of identity, racism, sexuality, and social justice but was best known for political verse in the Vietnam War period. Some words from her “What Kind of Times are These”:

I’ve walked there picking mushrooms at the edge of dread,  
 but don’t be fooled  
 this isn’t a Russian poem, this is not somewhere else but here,  
 our country moving closer to its own truth and dread,  
 its own ways of making people disappear.

Rebecca Gordon, astrologer, author, philosophy teacher at the University of San Francisco, worker for peace and justice nationally and internationally, posted this at 4:39 p.m. on November 20, 2016:

“I’m old (62), a little ragged around the edges and prone to the occasional night terror. But I’m too old and too stubborn to cede my country to the faces of hatred and a nihilistic desire to blow the whole thing up just to see where the pieces come down. I’ve fought, and organized and loved too long to give up now.”

On a happier, lighter note, we welcomed 11 (!) new members into the USH: Adam Brown, JoAnne Bauer, Miriam Byroade, Laura Stewart Cipriano, Paul Cipriano, Lisa Galinski, Maxx Gianni, Julie Grace, Lindsey Jones, Thom Rowell and Linda Lee Stein. They made a vocal commitment to this community to respect its heritage, support its health, contribute their talent, time and resources to assure that it is a generous, learning community of service. After the service, they signed the USH Membership Book and had a group photo followed by cake and ice cream.

Rayla’s message (to all of us) was particularly potent today. During her week just ended, she was “not in a very good place,” and wanted to lash out. Once, on her way home, she passed a homeless man just standing on the street and she “cried all the way home.” Then she made a big breakfast, took it back and gave it to the hungry and grateful man. They hugged, and she had “channeled my negative feelings into something positive. We should do this again and again and again.”

The Rion Starr family was much in evidence today. They led us in our gathering song (Sweet Honey in the Rock's "We Are the Ones"), as Rev. Heather sang the low notes, Rev. Cathy the high notes, Robin shook the tambourine, and we had our choice of whom to follow. Also, they replaced the 16th Black Lives Matter signs stolen from the church's front lawn; Rev. Heather vowed "We refuse to be silenced." And she had changed the first verse in Hymn 168 to be sung as "We will (s)take one more sign (replacing "step") 'til there is peace for us and everyone."

I was delighted that the line to light candles of memory and hope was so long because it gave our pianist Isaac time to create the wonderful variations on "Spirit of Life" he is wont to do. Music to my ears.

On my way to one of my other jobs last night, another opportunity presented itself. In that moment I knew what I had to do. I was going to be late for work as my heart strings were pulling at me in that moment to act. As part of Rev. Heather's call to action, and as my own heart calls me to do, I will act out of love and kindness over and over and over again. I will Stand on the Side of Love! When I got home, I spoke with my kids about making sacrifices in order to go above and beyond in our commitment to do what was right. I explained to them the impact they would experience because of the action I took. And they agreed that I had made the right decision to stop and act with a kind and loving heart and they were okay with the impact. It calls to me and it fills me and they get that.

When I arrived at USH today, there were two notes left for me. I don't know who left them but I want to thank you from the bottom of my heart. It was a huge blessing and I am grateful. It is someone reaching out in kindness and that kindness rippling to another and another. One of the quotes in one note reads, "Never believe that a small group of dedicated people can't change the world. For indeed, that's all who ever have." –Margaret Mead. I pledge to be one of those dedicated people. And like I said on Sunday, "I will let the hurt fuel my heart and not my hate." **Namaste.**

#### **AIM Team's Project and Workshop Plans**

As part of the process of gaining accreditation from our denomination for being a church that's particularly accessible, welcoming, inclusive and supportive of people with physical, mental or psychological disabilities and their families, the AIM (Accessibility and Inclusion Ministry) task force has just submitted a 24-page document to the UUA with the details of our congregation's plans for the next several years.

The plans include a series of workshops for the congregation (we're already planning for others that aren't listed here) and these proposed projects. 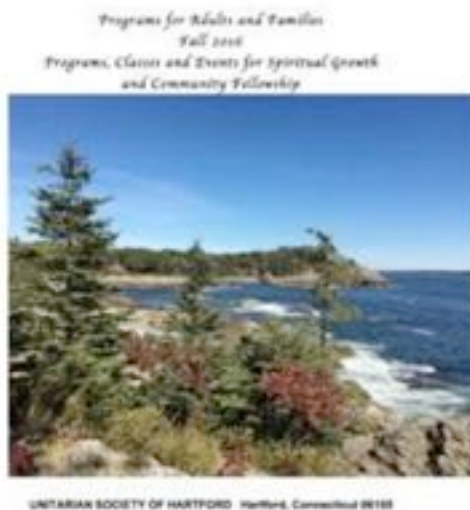
